

ERC in a nutshell



- Created in 2007, the European Research Council (ERC) is the first pan-European funding body supporting the best frontier research in Europe.
- The ERC is led by scientists, like the US NSF and NIH. It aims to stimulate scientific excellence in Europe by supporting the very best researchers in any field of research. Excellence is the sole criterion for selection; there are neither thematic priorities, nor geographical quotas for funding. ERC competitions are open to top researchers from anywhere in the world. The projects are assessed by high level international peer-review panels.
- As part of *Horizon 2020*, the new EU Programme for Research and Innovation (2014 to 2020), the ERC has received over €13 billion, which represents around 17% of *Horizon 2020* total budget. Compared to the previous seven-year programme (FP7) this is a substantial increase of its budget. The ERC is also a key part of the first pillar of *Horizon 2020*, 'Excellent Science'.
- The ERC grants help to bring about new and unpredictable scientific and technological discoveries - the kind that can form the basis of new industries, markets, and broader social innovations in the future.
- Each ERC grantee employs on average six team members, thus contributing to training a new generation of excellent scientists. To date, the ERC has funded over 4,000 grantees and has supported some 26,000 other team members, offering cutting-edge research training for nearly 7,000 doctoral students and about 10,000 postdoctoral researchers.
- Under Horizon 2020, it is estimated that around 7,000 grantees will be funded and 42,000 team members supported, offering cutting-edge research training for nearly 11,000 doctoral students and almost 16,000 postdoctoral researchers.
- The ERC has funded eight Nobel Prize laureates and three Field medallists.
- To date, ERC grantees of 64 nationalities are hosted in over 500 institutions in 29 countries across Europe.
- Over **20,000 papers** acknowledging ERC support have been published in international, peer-reviewed journals such as *Science* or *Nature*.
- Several EU countries have introduced reforms in their national funding agencies and programmes based on the ERC approach and procedures.

The ERC has three core grant schemes:

- 'ERC Starting Grants' targeted at early-career, emerging research leaders;
- 'ERC Consolidator Grants' aimed at excellent researchers who are already independent;
- 'ERC Advanced Grants' supporting established top researchers.

Two additional funding initiatives with a limited budget:

- 'ERC Synergy Grants' introduced on a pilot basis to support a few small groups of researchers working together on the same project;
- 'ERC Proof of Concept' funding open only to ERC grant-holders.
